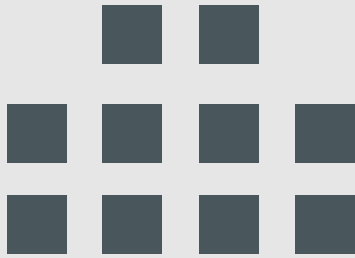

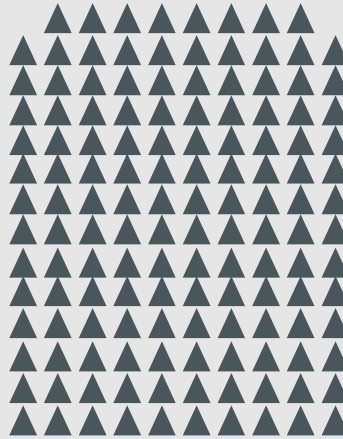

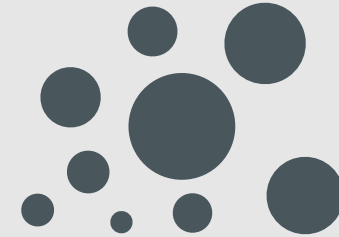

In **8** selected African countries, there are **69** additional usable sports grounds in **41** locations available for sports activities.



40 of these sports grounds are rehabilitated, **29** are newly constructed.

These **69** additional usable sports grounds are available for regular use by **185,621** children and young people.

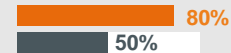

SPORTS GROUND MANAGEMENT & SUSTAINABILITY



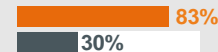
For every core country, there are concepts geared to the institutional dissemination and implementation of the S4D approach in **80%** of all supported partner organizations.



56% of operators regularly implement measures geared to the care and maintenance of the additional usable sports grounds.



83% of operators have a current sports ground usage plan.



The S4D approach is made visible by **136** high-visibility measures through partner organizations in core countries. Additional **13** in non-core countries.

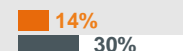
COACHES & INSTRUCTORS



S4DA implemented **19** S4D workshops for coaches.

S4DA trained **409** S4D coaches across 6 countries, **31%** of them are female. **59** S4D coaches, **32%** of them female, trained by SV are still involved in S4DA.

56 of the trained coaches (14%) implement the S4D approach in line with the quality criteria defined in their S4D coach workshop.*



S4DA implemented **6** S4D workshops for instructors.

S4DA trained **129** S4D instructors, **34%** of them female. **8** S4D instructors, **25%** of them female, trained by SV are still involved in S4DA.

24 of the 129 involved S4D instructors (19%) implemented at least one S4D workshop for coaches.** **7** S4D instructors implemented at least one S4D instructor workshop.



Within S4DA, **1,204** coaches were trained by partners on sports-related topics.

* So far, less than 10% of the trained coaches were observed during their training sessions by S4DA. Based on these results, around 80% of the observed coaches implement the S4DA approach in line with the quality criteria. As data is missing, the result is currently around 14%. S4DA will increase the number of training observations in 2018.

** Due to the fact that most of the S4D instructors are implementing several S4D workshops for coaches and the high number of trained S4D coaches based on the need of the local partners, this indicator might not be reached till end of 2018.

CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE



Verifiably, more than **2,684** disadvantaged children and youth are participating regularly in offered S4D activities by trained S4D coaches.***



*** The number of children regularly taking part in S4D activities might be much higher, but due to lack of reliable data higher numbers could not be properly verified. S4DA will further improve the quality of collected data to be able to communicate reliable numbers.

- **56** of them implement the S4D approach in line with the quality criteria defined in their S4D coach workshop.*
- Within S4DA **129** S4D instructors, **34%** of them female, were trained. **8** S4D instructors, **25%** of them female, trained by SV are still involved in S4DA.
- **24** of the 129 involved S4D instructors (19%) implemented at least one S4D workshop for coaches.** **7** S4D instructors implemented at least one S4D instructor workshop.
- Within S4DA **1,204** coaches were trained by partners on sports-related topics.

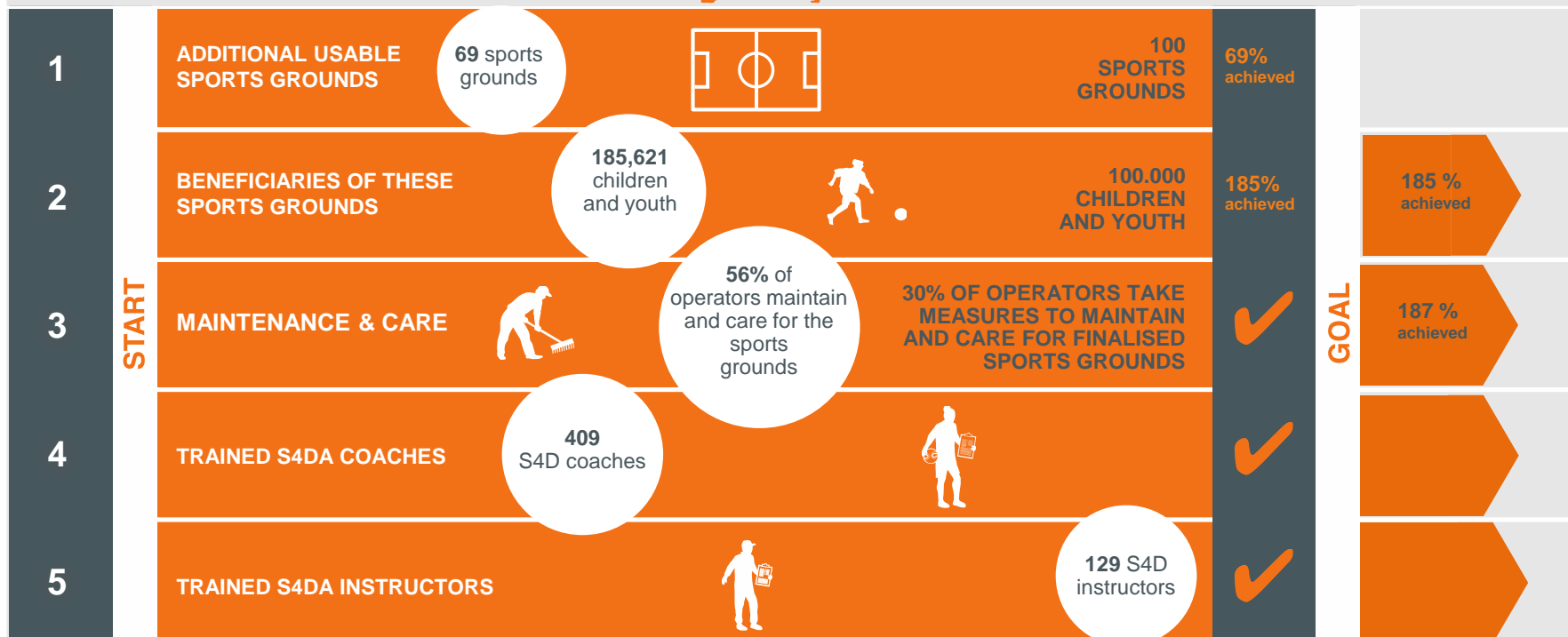

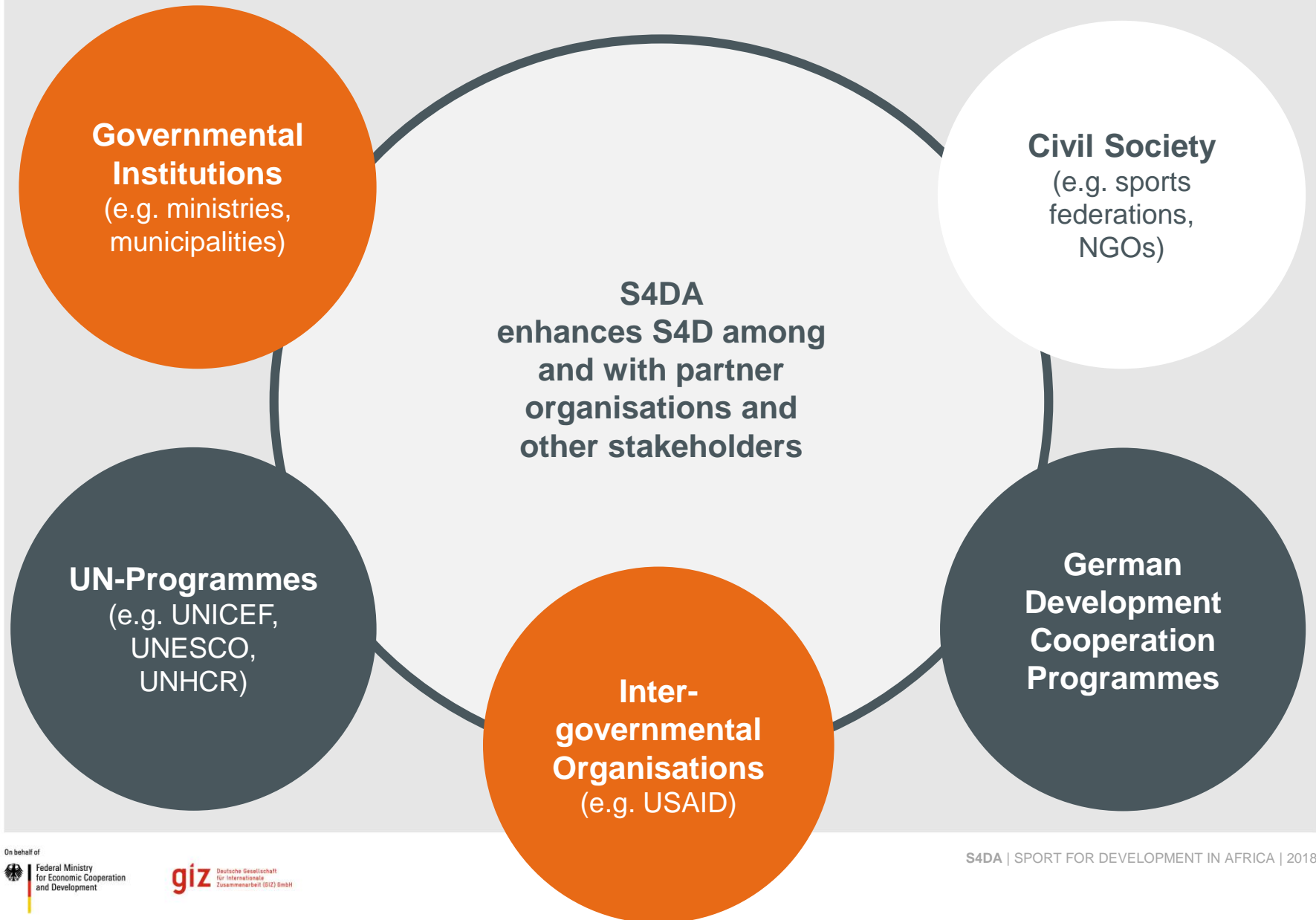

S4DA PROMOTES SYNERGIES & COOPERATION



S4DA PROMOTES GENDER EQUALITY

Over **30%** of all trained S4D coaches and instructors are girls and women.

Gender responsive standards for the rehabilitation/new construction of sports grounds were developed.

S4DA closely cooperates with the **Interdisciplinary Centre for Gender Studies** of the University of Bern.

Thanks to a netball court in northern Namibia girls have **a safe space** to exercise for the first time.

The **Kenyan Football Federation** in partnership with S4DA invited to the first symposium on “**Women, Sport and Development**” in late 2017. A **quota of women** for the offered instructor workshops within the federation is in planning.

S4DA PROMOTES SUSTAINABILITY

S4D elements were included in **national curricula** in Namibia and Mozambique.

To ensure the **sustainable use of sports grounds** in terms of delivery of S4D activities and technical maintenance of sports grounds S4DA supports partners in the development and embedding of **a S4D concept** in their organisation.

S4DA & DECENTRALIZATION

In **Togo**, the established **municipal steering committees** lead to **a better dialogue between local governments and civil society**. They are responsible for the management of the new GIZ supported sports grounds as well as the sports equipment sets.

S4DA works towards the inclusion of financial support for the maintenance and management of the sports grounds in the **municipal budgets**.

S4DA & SUPPORTING REFUGEES AND HOST COMMUNITIES

In **Kenya**, trained coaches offer S4D activities in Turkana West and Kakuma refugee camp, **promoting peaceful encounters, dialogue and friendship among refugee and local community.**

Being **role models** themselves, they allow others to interact and exchange through sports activities.

S4DA and partner organisations together with the **Kenya Football Federation** scaled up the **S4D approach** spreading its methodology across Kenya through trained S4D coaches.

S4DA & VOCATIONAL EDUCATION



In **Ethiopia**, with the support of S4DA the Federal TVET Agency (FTA) considers the **integration of S4D** in the curricula of the TVET colleges. Therefore, **departments for physical education** are planned to be established in the colleges with dedicated personnel.

S4DA also facilitates the **involvement of the private sector**. A first cooperation with companies at two TVET sports ground facilities in Addis Ababa has been initiated to support the **sustainable utilisation and maintenance** of the grounds.

S4DA & TEACHER EDUCATION



Together with education authorities, local governments and local associations the **S4D approach is spread in local communities** through trained S4D coaches.

All physical education teachers, who are trained at the Pedagogic University of Maputo, study the S4D approach as part of their curricula and **apply the S4D methods at schools across Mozambique.**

S4DA & EDUCATION

S4DA supports the **National Ministry of Education, Arts and Culture in Namibia** to integrate S4D in the school curriculum.

In the north of Namibia, S4DA cooperates with the regional directorate of the Ministry and aims at improving the **access to sport and S4D in schools and Vocational Training Centers.**
